The first think that must be stated here is sympathy for the author in such a despicable family and support upbringing. I do believe the story to be quite plausible from a time period standpoint. It's very easy, even today, for an abused child so groomed in covering up, to slip through the cracks. And, because of the damage to them emotionally, ongoing abusive situations and poor choices continue the cycle. That being said I gave three stars because of the tedious nature of the story telling, the repetitive descriptives (if I read "my horrible mother" one time, I read it fifty times, and errors in continuity. While the original intent of the books, as stated by the author, was a therapeutic tool, how can a main character's name change from paragraph to paragraph? I didn't read as a personal memoir. At times the writing is rather pedantic and just plain boring. I did read all three novels from a curiosity standpoint but then again, I also read the back of cereal boxes and just about anything in orint that crosses my vision.

This author tells her story in such a way it makes the reader feel like you know the people in the story. Once you start reading you can't stop. It's like a great movie and you can't pull yourself away for a moment in fear you will miss something but with the book you can't find a place to stop reading because you have to know what's next. This is a great series. I recommend it to anyone who reads true stories.
